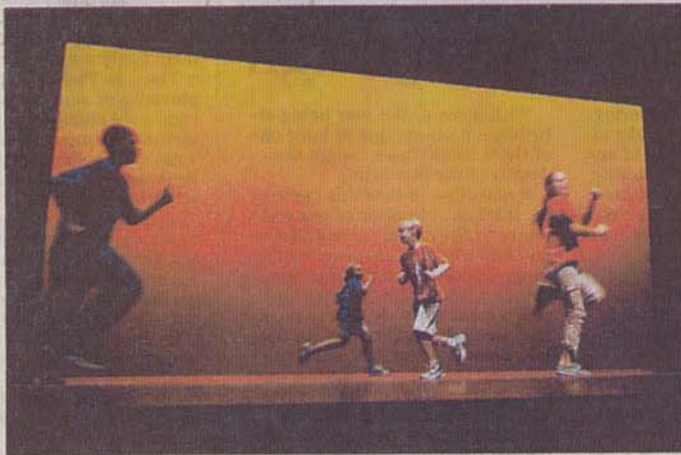

About 20 rising fifth- and sixth-graders enrolled at Rashkis Elementary School perform a preview of their upcoming dance season titled "An African Village" at UNC's Memorial Hall on Tuesday. The performance was part of N.C. Arts in Action's showcase performance for the Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools' annual Back to School Convocation for teachers and administrators. City schools teachers reported to work on Friday, and students in grades 1-12 will begin classes on Monday. N.C. Arts in Action is a community-based nonprofit that aims to impact children's lives through exposure to the arts. The program began at Rashkis Elementary in January 2006 and will expand to other yet-to-be-announced North Carolina schools this school year. Four of the students who performed on Tuesday — Hannah Davis, Christine Park, Jecori Owens-Schuler and Joshua Lai — were recipients of a N.C. Arts in Action summer scholarship to participate in the National Dance Institute's Irene Diamond Institute in New York City.
