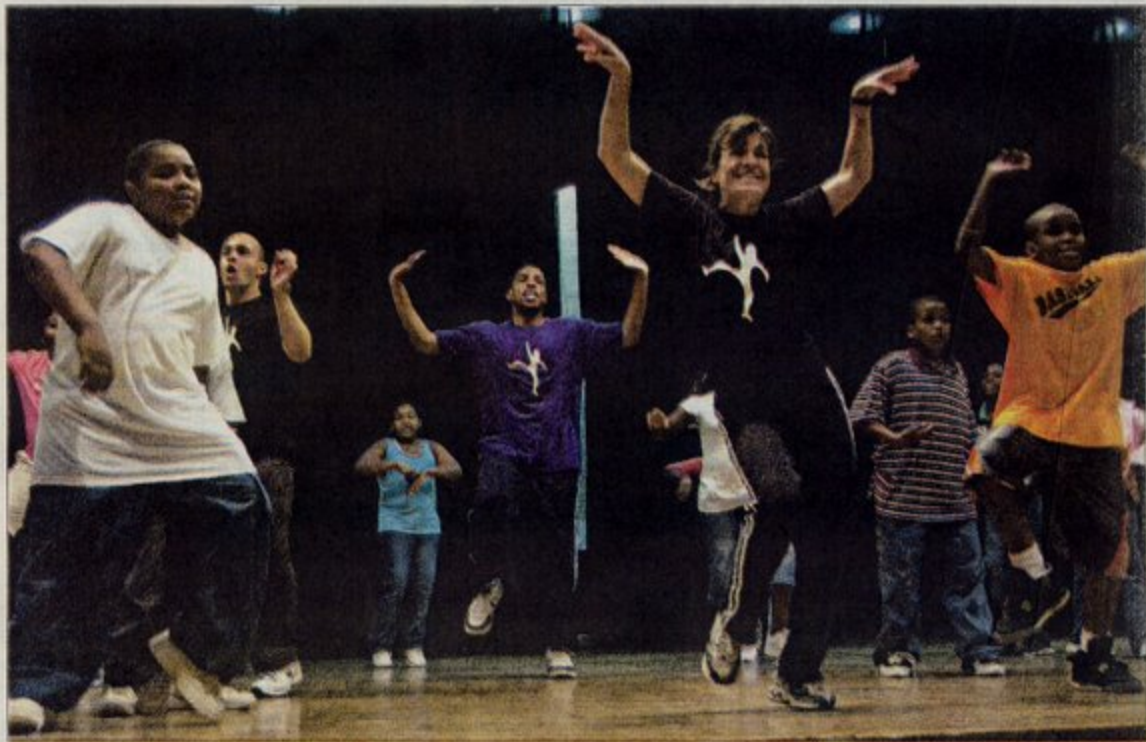


Class time
